Throughout October SCOPE will feature *Back Roads to Far Places*, the work of Castlemaine artist Jan Lancaster. Lancaster's evocative abstracted paintings have been inspired by various landscape locations including the High Country, the Great Ocean Road and Port Fairy. The exhibition will open at 2.30pm on Saturday October 1 with guest speaker Gareth Colliton. The artist will be present at the opening event.

## New additions

SCOPE is pleased to welcome the sculptural work of Portland artist **Carmel Wallace**. Carmel works across a variety of media and has an extensive exhibiting record both nationally and internationally.

Working with various themes and processes, the work of **Michael Parker** is a new addition to SCOPE Galleries. His popular abstracted resin-based works are currently on display, together with work from his aerial landscape series and his boat series.

Mixed media works by **The Naughty See Monkey** are creating much interest at SCOPE. The collaged works combine a variety of media in complex and layered compositions. The works can be hung in various groupings and are unframed which allows for personal selection of a suite of images.

The work of local artist **Trevor Holder** is also new to SCOPE. Holder is a painter, that adds a unique sculptural quality to his surfaces through the addition of materials including paper and wood. SCOPE currently carries work from two of his series, one based on landscape the other on various urban scapes influenced by Holder's travels.

Warrnambool artist **Tim Walker** has produced a series of greeting cards displaying his paintings of Warrnambool scenes such as Wollaston Bridge, Penguin Island and a range of other familiar local sites. These cards will appeal to many, and a selection is now available for purchase at SCOPE Galleries. Cairns based photographer **Gerhard Hillman** has also supplied SCOPE with a beautiful range of cards showing vibrant and unique compositions that highlight his creative photographic and computer skills. Both ranges of cards are blank to allow for personal messages and are suitable for any occasion.

## Artist Accolades

Printmaker **Marion Manifold** and painter **Liza McCosh** were both preselected as finalists in the recent Corangamarah Art Prize. Judged by Robert Lindsay, Director of the McLelland Sculpture Park, Manifold's work was highly commended in the judging. Her work has also been selected as a finalist in the *2010 Silk Cut Award* and the prestigious *Fremantle Print Award* in which she has previously been a winner.

**Liza McCosh** will be featured alongside Craig Gough, Jen Mallinson and Les Peach in an upcoming exhibition entitled *Abstraction in Focus*. The exhibition is part of a series of exhibitions curated by Isabel McGee from McGee's Gallery and can be viewed at 27 Gipps Street, Richmond (formerly Christine Abrahams Gallery). The opening event will be held on Thursday September 16 from 6-8pm and all the exhibiting artists will be present. Other exhibitions in the series include *Simply Surreal* and *People... Places*
